Addison Museum Acquires Original Civil War Roster

The Addison Historical Museum recently acquired a rare, original memorial roster of the Civil War era Addison Guards, Company I, 105th Illinois Volunteer Regiment for its permanent collection.

The 105th Illinois Volunteer Infantry Regiment was organized in Dixon, Illinois in 1862 by Henry F. Vallette. Company I was mostly made up of DuPage County residents – a total of 98 men rostered of which at least 61 whom hailed from Addison Township.

The regiment initially served as part of the Army of the Ohio from September to November 1862; then as part of the Post of Gallatin, Tennessee, from November 1862 - June 1863; and finally with the Army of the Cumberland from June 1863 - June 1865.

The 105th Illinois Volunteer Infantry Regiment engaged in guard and picket duty with slight skirmishing during its first year and a half of service. It was not until the opening of the Atlanta Campaign in May 1864 that it faced sustained warfare.

It went on to fight in many significant battles during the Civil War, including:

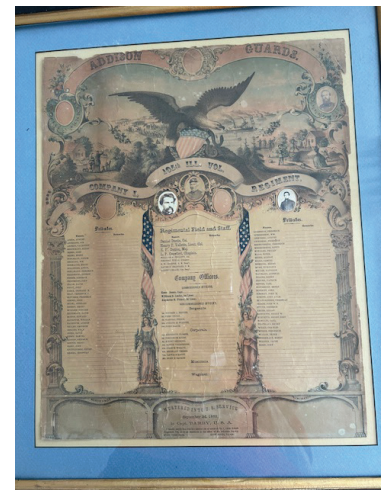
- Resaca: The regiment’s first combat was at Resaca on May 15, 1864, where they lost 48 men killed or wounded.
- Pumpkin Vine Creek: The regiment operated along Pumpkin Vine Creek from May 26 - June 5, 1864.
- Siege of Atlanta: The regiment participated in the

- Siege of Atlanta from July 22 - August 2, 1864
- Battle of Bentonville: The regiment fought in the Battle of Bentonville from March 19 - 22, 1864.

Following the war, the 105th took part in the “Grand Review” in Washington, D.C. on May 24, 1865. The men were then mustered out of service on June 7.

The memorial roster was acquired from the sale of a Civil War enthusiast’s personal collection with funding assistance from the Addison Historical Society and the Village of Addison. It is currently on display in the military room of the Addison Historical Museum.

The museum is open Wednesday through Friday, 11a.m. - 4 p.m. Admission is free.

Unfunded Mandate Forces Treatment Plant Consolidation

Phosphorus Removal Requirements to be Implemented

For many years, the Village of Addison has operated two wastewater treatment facilities, enabling the village to provide clean, safe water to all residents, as well as handle the needs of our commercial and industrial businesses.

Due to new regulations from the Environmental Protection Agency, all municipalities and sanitary districts in Illinois must implement phosphorus removal at all wastewater treatment plants by the year 2030. The village has done engineering studies to determine the best operational and financial route for implementing this new unfunded mandate by the federal government.

These studies have determined that the most fiscally responsible route will be to consolidate the two wastewater treatment plants and to eliminate the combined sewer system. Consolidation will reduce long-term operation and maintenance costs, and will reduce future capital improvement programs to which both

treatment plants would be subject.

The estimated cost of this project is \$150 million. The Village has no option but to implement an EPA/ plant consolidation fee, since there will be no available grants or loan forgiveness for phosphorus removal.

The design engineering for these projects will begin this year. Construction for the separation of the combined sewer will begin in 2025, and construction of plant consolidation is slated for 2026.

Registration Requirements

- Must be a U.S. citizen
- Must be at least 18 by election day
- Must have been a resident in the precinct for at least 30 days prior to Election Day
- Provide two forms of ID: one of which must have your correct name and address on it

Registration Deadlines

- October 8, 2024: deadline to register by mail to vote
- October 20, 2024: deadline to register online to vote
- October 31, 2024: deadline for election authority to receive a mail-in application to vote by mail
- November 5, 2024: General Election Day; voter registration available at your voting location; deadline for any registered voter to return a completed Vote by Mail ballot in person to an election authority

What do I need to get a library card?

To register yourself or your child for a library card, you need a photo ID with your current address. If your photo ID doesn't have your current address, please bring in an item from the list at addisonlibrary.org/get-a-card.

Does it cost anything to get a library card?

Residents of incorporated Addison can sign up for their library card at no cost. Residents of unincorporated Addison may purchase a library card for a fee that will be calculated using your property tax bill.

Free library cards are available to any student living in an unincorporated area whose household falls at or below the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Income Eligibility Guidelines.

Back To School Fire Safety

- It's almost time for the school bells to ring and students to return to their classrooms. The Red Cross offers ten ways to help make sure your student is safe as they head back to school for the upcoming year.

School Safety Tips

- If your student rides a bus to school, they should plan to get to their bus stop early and stand away from the curb while waiting for the bus to arrive.
- Students should board the bus only after it has come to a complete stop and the driver or attendant has instructed them to get on. They should only board their bus, never an alternate one.
- All students should stay in clear view of the bus driver and never walk behind the bus.
- Cross the street at the corner, obey traffic signals and stay in the crosswalk.
- Never dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.
- If children go to school in a car, they should always wear a seat belt. Younger children should use car seats or booster seats until the lap-shoulder belt fits properly (typically for children ages 8-12 and over 4'9"), and ride in the back seat until they are at least 13 years old.
- If a teenager is going to drive to school, parents should mandate that they use seat belts. Drivers should not use their cell phone to text or make calls and avoid eating or drinking while driving.
- Some students ride their bike to school. They should always wear a helmet and ride on the right, in the same direction as the traffic is going.
- When children are walking to school, they should only cross the street at an intersection, and use a route along which the school has placed crossing guards.
- Parents should walk young children to school, along with children taking new routes or attending new schools, at least for the first week to ensure they know how to get there safely. Arrange for students to walk to school with a friend or classmate.
