Addison Events are More than Rock 'N Wheels

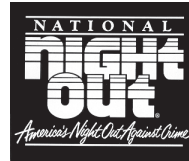
The Village of Addison is proud to offer an entire summer of fun, with 13 weeks of concerts as part of the 13th season of *Rock 'N Wheels*.

Former Village Trustee Gave 25 Years of Service

The Village of Addison elected officials and staff were saddened by the news of the passing of Sylvia Layne, former village trustee, at the age of 91.



Sylvia Layne

Sylvia was the wife of former Addison Trail High School Principal Don Layne, and together they raised their three children in Addison.

In 1992, when a vacancy occurred on the Village Board of Trustees, she was appointed by Village President Anthony Russotto, and continued to be re-elected until she retired in 2017.

Sylvia served for many years as the chair of the Finance & Policy Committee.

She served during a time of great progress in Addison, as the entertainment corridor was created, utility lines were buried along Lake Street as it was widened, and the construction of three integral public buildings – the Public Works Facility, the new Village Hall, and the Henry Hyde Neighborhood Resource Center. Her dedication to our community was deeply appreciated.

Addison Facilities and Construction Partners, are set to commence our summer capital improvement initiatives on May 31st, focusing on enhancing both Stone and Fullerton Elementary Schools.

The project at Stone Elementary involves a revamped main office area, installation of a new elevator, and final enhancements to the innovation center, which underwent a comprehensive transformation last summer. Meanwhile, at Fullerton Elementary, our efforts are directed towards ensuring clean air quality across all schools by overhauling the HVAC system entirely. Additionally, we'll be installing new energy-efficient light fixtures, upgrading to an annunciating fire alarm system, refreshing ceilings, creating more versatile breakout spaces, and establishing a new innovation center.

We are committed to completing both projects in time for the upcoming 2024-2025 School Year.

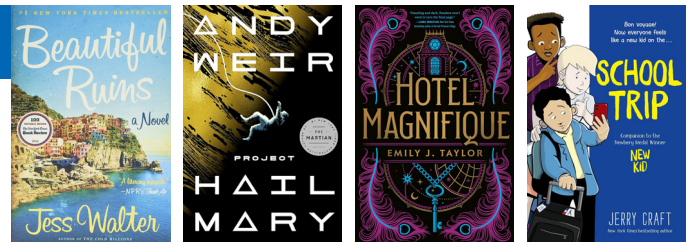


How do I sign up?

Lithium-Ion Battery Safety

Lithium-Ion Batteries supply power to many kinds of devices including smart phones, laptops, e-scooters and e-bikes, e-cigarettes, toys, and even cars. If not used correctly, or damaged, these batteries can catch on fire or explode

Problem

- These Batteries store a large amount of energy in small amount of space
- Sometimes batteries are not used the right way
- Like any product, a small number of these batteries are defective. They can overheat, catch fire or explode.

Safety Tips

- Purchase and use devices that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory. Such as UL or CSA.
- Always follow manufacturers instructions.
- Only use battery that is designed for the device.
- Only use charging cord that came with device.
- Store batteries away from anything that can catch fire.

Signs of Problems

- Stop using the battery if you notice these problems: odor, change in color, too much heat, change in shape, leaking or odd noises. If it is safe to do so, move the device away from anything that can catch fire. Call 911
