The parade steps off from Addison Trail High School at 3 p.m. and proceeds east down Army Trail Blvd. to Kennedy Drive.

Students at Indian Trail Junior High have been participating in the Addison Great Shake, a soft skills-based competition that challenges students to think on their feet. The event has taken place throughout the school year, beginning with hundreds of students and narrowing down to the final rounds. As part of the experience, Chantelle Porter presided over *The People v. Goldilocks*, where student participants took on the roles of attorneys and managed all aspects of the trial. Former Great Shake contestants returned as Goldilocks and the three bears, helping bring the case to life. Now in the second-to-last round, students continue to build real-world skills such as public speaking, critical thinking, and confidence.

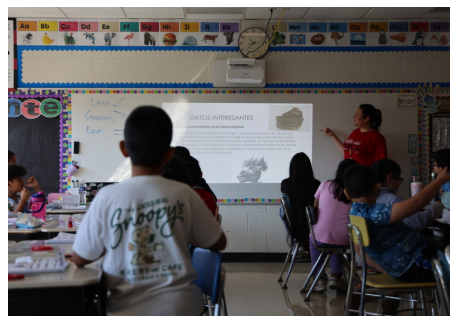
STEM Soccer Camp with Chicago Fire FC

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Senior Property Tax Relief Programs



Senior Homestead Exemption: Provides an \$8,000 reduction in assessed value for residents age 65+. Requires a one-time application with proof of age and ownership, and renews automatically once approved.

Senior Assessment Freeze: Freezes the assessed value of a home for qualifying seniors with household income of \$65,000 or less. Requires an annual application and income verification; taxes may still change based on local rates.

Community Market Food Pantry is open on Wednesdays for you to choose your groceries. Call to schedule a "shopping" appointment to help stretch your grocery budget. Emergency food is available from 8:00 AM-4:00 PM M-F at Door #1 without an appointment.

Emergency and General Assistance programs provide financial support to eligible residents, including one-time help for urgent needs and ongoing assistance for basic living expenses. General Assistance may also support individuals while they seek employment or await disability benefits.

Benefits Access provides reduced-cost license plate renewals and a free RTA transit card for low-income senior citizens and disabled individuals.

Ride DuPage: provides affordable, on-demand transportation for seniors and individuals with disabilities. Rides can be scheduled in advance for medical appointments, errands, and more.

Passport Services: The Township offers passport application services by appointment. Staff assists residents with completing and submitting required documentation.

Medical Lending Closet: offers free, short-term loans of durable medical equipment such as wheelchairs, walkers, and crutches for residents in need.

ADDISON TOWNSHIP Mental Health Board

The Mental Health Board continues to build a strong foundation for expanding access to care across Addison Township. Earlier this year, the Board awarded \$1,147,250 in grant funding to 22 agencies, supporting a wide range of mental health programs for residents.

In addition to funding, the Board is focused on strengthening partnerships and understanding community needs. We hosted an Appreciation and Networking Event to bring funded agencies together and foster collaboration. We also launched a community needs assessment survey to better identify service gaps and barriers to access, followed by a Providers Forum to hear directly from service providers and gather input on emerging needs.



As we move forward, these efforts will help guide future funding decisions and ensure that services remain responsive, coordinated, and accessible to those who need them most.

SMOKE ALARM FACTS

Working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in a home fire in half. Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, inside bedrooms, and outside sleeping areas. Interconnected alarms provide the best protection.

Test your smoke alarms monthly by pressing the test button. Replace batteries at least once a year, or when the alarm chirps. Replace the entire smoke alarm unit every 10 years for optimal performance.

FIRE PREVENTION TIPS
