REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

1. **Call to Order:**

Chairman Hartwig called the meeting of November 7, 2024 to order at 4:04 p.m. Present for the meeting were Commissioner Franciere, Commissioner Tovelio, Commissioner Diaz, Chief Selvik, Detective Commander Pope, Attorney Dave Freeman and Recording Secretary Lehman. Commissioner Hundley was excused.

2. **Approval of the August 1, 2024 Regular & Executive Meeting Minutes:**

Motion to approve the August 1, 2024, Regular and Executive Meeting Minutes by Commissioner Tovelio; second by Commissioner Diaz; motion unanimously carried by voice vote.

5. **New Business:**

1. New Recruit Final List

Commander Pope stated 202 applications were received; 141 took the written test; 134 passed; 97 showed up for the mandatory orientation/POWER test; resulting in a final total of 68 new recruits on list.

Motion to accept the new recruit list as presented by Commissioner Tovelio; second by Commissioner Franciere; motion unanimously carried by voice vote. Chairman Hartwig signed the new recruit list, which expires on November 7, 2026.

Commissioner Tovelio asked how police department moral was, which Chief Selvik stated moral is up. Commissioner Tovelio commented police personnel looked happy during the POWER test.

Commander Pope stated looking to hire two for the January academy; POWER test on December 10, 2024 and will bring four qualified recruits in front of the Board for oral interviews.

Chairman Hartwig inquired on crime rate, which Chief Selvik stated crime is down; however, property crime is up. The police department has an aggressive detective and Tac Unit, who are proactive and are doing a good job. They have removed 20 to 30 guns off the street and have recovered some pistols with switches. Chief Selvik stated the department is spending \$20,000.00 on stop sticks, as well as change the pursuit policy consistent with DuPage County. He added that training and technology have come a long way. Chairman Hartwig asked if there were any police issues at Rock-N-Wheels this year, which Chief Selvik stated the first night only.

Commissioner Tovelio asked if the police department conducts active shooter training, which Commander Pope stated they just completed one inside the closed Stratford Square Mall using different scenarios.

Motion to remove two remaining recruits on list, Gerardo Hernandez and Jamice Flower, resulting in list officially expired by Commissioner Tovello; second by Commissioner Diaz; motion unanimously carried by voice vote.

Motion to remove the three laterals from the list, Anthony Miller, Jr., Javonni M. Harrell and Charles Delgado by Commissioner Tovello; second by Commissioner Franciere; motion unanimously carried by voice vote.

Board of Police Commissioners concur with recommendation to extend Police Officer Natalie Obrzut probationary period for an additional eight months until October 28, 2025.

Chairman Hartwig stated the next meeting is December 3, 2024 at 4:00 p.m. Chief Selvik commented the academy starts January 6, 2025 and the POWER test on December 10, 2024. Chairman Hartwig stated the Board would be interviewing four candidates on December 3, 2024. Commissioner Tovello inquired how many backgrounds will be conducted, which Commander Pope stated 30 backgrounds.
